IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- **Parents and students must sign this form.**
- Courses with a 1 next to them last all year. Courses with a ½ next to them last one semester, or ½ a year.
- All 7th grade students must sign up for Keyboarding. If they take Keyboarding in the summer, an alternate elective will be used. Students who pass Keyboarding will receive .5 credits for high school. Summer school information will be available toward the end of April.
- Students must have a physical exam on file in order to participate in the athletics class or in any athletic sport. Students signed up for Athletics are expected to participate in at least one sport—football (boys), volleyball (girls), basketball, track.
- Students participating in only cross-Country, golf and/or tennis do not need to be in Athletics.

Which classes earn high school credits?

8th grade high school credit courses do not count toward your student's high school grade point average (GPA). The grade will be recorded on your student's high school transcript, but it will not count toward the GPA. Note exceptions.*

* Honor or Pre-AP classes (Algebra I Pre-AP, Geometry Pre-AP, Spanish II H, Spanish III Pre-AP, and Spanish IV AP) are exceptions; these classes WILL count toward your student's high school GPA.

What are the requirements for Spanish I?

Spanish I is open enrollment. Any student may sign up for Spanish I if they feel they can meet the course requirements. It is a two-year commitment. A student would take Spanish IA in 7th grade during both semesters and Spanish IB in 8th grade during both semesters. Both years together equal 1.0 high school credit.

How do I get into Spanish II-H or Spanish III Pre-AP?

A student must have completed the 6th grade dual language program and placement exams or be approved through the counseling office. Approval requires successful completion of placement exams.

7th Grade Advanced Classes: All 6th grade students meeting advanced class criteria will be considered for advanced classes.
